The City of Clarkston reserves the right to reject any or all bids based on past performance and to waive technicalities and informalities and re-advertise.

Fax, email or late proposals will not be recognized.

Clarkston Procurement Department
(General Instructions to Offeror)

1. The following instructions are to be considered an integral part of this proposal, unless otherwise requested and must be typewritten or printed in blue ink. The person signing the bid solicitation documents must initial any changes or corrections made to this proposal, using blue ink.
2. The Offeror shall submit their proposal electronically unless otherwise directed. Submitted and received proposals may not be withdrawn or modified in any way after the cut-off date and time displayed.
3. The blackout period begins from the issue date of the solicitation and until a supplier is selected. A supplier's violation of the restriction on communication will result in (immediate) disqualification of the supplier's response from consideration for contract award and/or other disciplinary action such as suspension or debarment.
4. If there are any questions whatsoever regarding any portion of the advertised solicitation, it becomes the responsibility of the person, firm, or company to seek clarification using BidNet Question & Answers portal prior to the deadline of question, answer and clarification.
5. Addendum(s) will be published with the corresponding solicitation within the BidNet Direct website www.bidnetdirect.com/georgia/cityofclarkston, no later than the suggested deadline.
6. It shall be the person, firm, or company's responsibility to check the BidNet Direct website www.bidnetdirect.com/georgia/cityofclarkston to locate documents associated with this bid solicitation.
7. The Offeror shall clearly indicate any variation(s) from the specification(s) in writing and include with their proposal.
8. The apparent silence of the specifications and any supplement specifications as to any details or the omission from it of a detailed description concerning any point shall be regarded as meaning; that only the best practices are to prevail and that only materials of first quality and correct type, size and design are to be used.
 - a. All workmanships shall be of a high quality.
 - b. All interpretations of the specification(s) shall be made upon the basis of the statement.
9. All bid solicitations shall be awarded to the most responsive and responsible offeror unless additional criteria and qualifications are established by the solicitation. If no criteria are specified in the solicitation, the award will be based upon the lump sum price alone.
10. In most cases, proposals shall be evaluated on the following items, but not necessarily in this order:
 - a. Cost (not always the winning proposal).
 - b. Offeror adheres to specifications.
 - c. Deliverables of good/service(s).
 - d. Past performance of person, firm or company to the City of Clarkston.
11. The City of Clarkston desires delivery of the material and/or services specified at the earliest possible time after the date of the award.
 - a. The offer shall provide an estimated time.
 - b. An unreasonable delivery proposal may be cause for the disqualification of a bid solicitation.
12. All prices shall be for delivery, our destination, and F.O.B. freight prepaid and allows, Clarkston, Georgia unless otherwise shown. *(if applicable)*
13. Cash discounts or end of month terms should be shown separately, even if terms are NET.

14. The City of Clarkston:

- a. Reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bid solicitations, due to past performance, etc. and waive any informality. Further, the City reserves the right to postpone the opening of the proposal(s) for its own convenience and to reject any or all proposals in response to this bid solicitation without indicating any reasons for such rejection(s).
 - b. Request and consider the submission of proposal modifications at any time before the award is made, if such is in the best interest of the City.
 - c. Requests for clarification and/or additional information can be requested from received Offerors only during the evaluation process.
 - d. Negotiate with the selected Offeror to include further services not identified in this bid solicitation.
 - e. In the event of contract termination, the City can enter into contract negotiations with another qualified Offeror that submitted acceptable proposals, rather than redoing the proposal process for the project.
 - f. Will reject the offeror's entire bid solicitation package upon discovery of changed bid solicitation documents without an addendum issued by the City of Clarkston Procurement Department.
 - g. Will accept or reject all bid solicitations within 90 days from the date of the bid opening.
15. The Offeror or contractor shall provide a copy of the person, firm, or company's Workers' Compensation Insurance with a limit of not less than required by the State of Georgia or otherwise stated in the bid solicitation instructions.
16. The Offeror or contractor shall provide a copy of the person, firm, or company's Commercial General Liability Insurance. (*if applicable*)
17. Federal or State Sales Tax are inapplicable to the City of Clarkston:
- a. Employer Identification Number (EIN) 58-6003756, form provided upon request.
 - b. Sales and Use Tax Exemption under O.C.G.A. § 48-8-3, form provided upon request.

Contractor's Code of Ethics

The City of Clarkston ("City"), through its Procurement Department, is committed to a procurement process that fosters fair and open competition, is conducted under the highest ethical standards and enjoys the complete confidence of the public.

To achieve these purposes, the Procurement Department requires each vendor who seeks to do business with the City to subscribe to this Contractor's Code of Ethics.

The Contractor affirms, they will:

1. Offer a proposal competitive, consistent, and appropriate to the bid documents.
2. Complete all aspects of any contract awarded to it at the contracted price pursuant to the terms set forth in the contract.
3. Submit timely, accurate, and appropriate invoices for goods and/or services performed under the contract.
4. Disclose to the City any direct or indirect personal interests a City employee or City official holds as it relates to a vendor contracted by the City.
5. Comply with all applicable laws, codes or regulations of the countries, states and localities in which they operate. This includes, but is not limited to, laws and regulations relating to environmental, occupational health and safety, and labor practices.
6. Request their suppliers including temporary labor agencies to do the same.
7. Conform their practices to any published standards for their industry are in compliance with laws, regulations and practices include, but are not limited to the following:
 - a. Obtaining and maintaining all required environmental permits. Further, the Contractor will endeavor to minimize natural resource consumption through conservation, recycling, and substitution methods.
 - b. Providing workers with a safe working environment, which includes identifying and evaluating workplace risks and establishing processes for which employees can report health and safety incidents, as well as providing adequate safety training.
 - c. Providing workers with an environment free of discrimination, harassment, and abuse, which includes establishing a written anti-discrimination and anti-bullying/harassment policy, as well as clearly noticed policies pertaining to forced labor, child labor, wage and hours, and freedom of association.

The Contractor affirms, they will not:

1. Discuss or consult with other competitors intending to bid on the same contract or similar City contract for the purpose of limiting competition. The vendor will not make any attempt to induce any individual or entity to submit or not submit a bid or proposal.
2. Disclose the terms of their bids or proposal, directly or indirectly, to any other competing company prior to the bid or proposal closing date.
3. Change the official bid solicitation documents, in any manner. When discovered, the entire bid solicitation package will be rejected.
4. Offer or give any gift, item or service of value, directly or indirectly, to a City employee, City official, employee family member or other vendor contracted by the City.
5. Cause, influence or attempt to cause or influence any City employee or family member or City Official or family member, which might tend to impair his/her objectivity or independence of judgment; or to use, or attempt to use, his/her official position to secure any unwarranted privileges or advantages for that vendor or for any other person.

(Terms and Conditions)

THE CONTRACT: The documents ("Contract Documents") that form the contract (the "Contract") between Buyer and Seller are the Buyer's purchase order (the "PO") issued to Seller, all documents referenced in the PO (including without limitation drawings, specifications, instructions, quality assurance requirements and any other referenced documents), all drawings, specifications and other documents referenced in the Buyer's request for quotation issued to Seller for the Contract (unless and to the extent such documents are excluded from the Contract by express provisions in, and not by mere omission from, the PO), supplements to the PO issued to Seller by Buyer, these Terms and Conditions, and all documents referenced in any Contract Documents. What is required in any one Contract Document shall be deemed required by all Contract Documents and the Contract. Where there is any conflict or inconsistency between the provisions in one or more of the contract documents, the provision entitled order of precedence shall be controlled, unless otherwise agreed in a writing signed by the representative (or his/her successor) of Buyer who signed the PO.

ACCEPTANCE: The acceptance by Seller that forms the Contract shall be deemed conclusively to have occurred upon Seller's acknowledgment of the PO, shipment of any goods, performance of any services, or commencement of any work on supplies or goods covered by the Contract. Any acceptance by Seller on purported terms and conditions that differ in any way from the provisions of the Contract shall be effective to form and bind Seller to the Contract, but such terms and conditions shall not become part of, or in any way alter, amend or otherwise modify any of the provisions of, the Contract. Any shipment of goods, performance of services, or commencement of work on supplies by Seller shall be deemed to be only upon the terms and conditions contained in the Contract, except to the extent that Buyer may otherwise expressly consent in a writing signed by the representative (or his/her successor) of Buyer who signed the PO. The Seller agrees that Buyer's acceptance or payment for any shipment of goods or similar act of Buyer shall not be claimed or construed to constitute such consent.

DELIVERY: (a) Delivery must be in strict compliance with the schedule contained in the Contract and shall be made by the Seller at such times and places and of such items and quantities as may from time to time be specified by the Buyer. If Seller fails to meet its scheduled delivery dates and Buyer elects to call for expedited shipments, Seller will pay the difference between the method of shipping specified and the actual expedited rate incurred. Seller shall be responsible for any additional charges resulting from deviation from Buyer's routing instructions. If Seller fails to make delivery promptly and regularly, as required under the Contract, Buyer may, in addition to other remedies available at law, terminate the Contract by giving notice to Seller. Title and risk of loss shall remain in Seller until goods are delivered to the F.O.B. point specified in the Contract. Notwithstanding such delivery, Seller shall bear risk of loss or damage to goods purchased hereunder from the time that Buyer gives notice of rejection of goods pursuant to the inspection provisions of this Contract. If Seller encounters or anticipates difficulty in meeting the delivery schedule, Seller shall immediately notify Buyer in writing, giving pertinent details; provided, however, that such data shall be informational only in character and shall not be construed as a waiver by Buyer of any delivery schedule or date or of any rights or remedies of Buyer provided by law or the Contract. Parts fabricated in excess or in advance of Buyer's release are at Seller's risk. The buyer reserves the right, without loss of discount privileges, to pay invoices covering items shipped in advance of the schedule on the normal maturity after the date specified for delivery. (b) Packaging and packing of items delivered by Seller under the contract shall insure safe arrival at their destination, secure the lowest transportation cost, conform to requirements of common carriers and, in any event, comply with Buyer's minimum specifications.

INSPECTION: Buyer shall have the right to inspect the goods and/or services supplied hereunder at any time during the manufacture or fabrication thereof at Seller's facilities or elsewhere. Such inspection may include, without limitation, raw materials, components, work in process, and completed products as well as drawings, specifications, and released data. Final inspection and acceptance shall be after delivery to the delivery point designated by Buyer. If any inspection or test is made by Buyer at Seller's facility or elsewhere, Seller shall

provide reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection personnel. The buyer may reject all goods supplied hereunder which are found to be defective. Goods so rejected may be returned to Seller at Seller's expense. No inspection, examination or test, regardless of extensiveness or type, and no approval given in connection with any such inspection, examination or test, whether under the Contract or another contract for the same or similar goods and/or services, shall relieve Seller, or be claimed by Seller to relieve it, of any obligation to comply fully with all requirements of the Contract, including the obligation to produce goods and/or services that conform to all requirements of the drawings, specifications and other Contract Documents. At Buyer's request, Seller shall repair or replace defective goods and/or services at Seller's expense. Failure to inspect goods and/or services, failure to discover defects in goods and/or services or payment for goods and/or services shall not constitute acceptance or limit any of Buyer's rights, including without limitation those under the warranty provisions of the Contract. In the event inspection reveals a defect or defects and schedule urgency requires that the defect or defects be corrected by Buyer to support production, all cost of such correction, including without limitation installation and removal, will be charged to Seller; such charges will also include time and material and appropriate indirect and overhead expenses. Seller shall maintain an inspection system acceptable to Buyer covering the goods and/or services furnished hereunder.

OVER SHIPMENT: Goods shall not be supplied in excess of quantities and shipping tolerances, if any, specified in the Contract. Seller shall be liable for handling charges and return shipment costs for any excess quantities, and unless Seller agrees to pay for such costs, the over shipped material will be retained by Buyer at no cost.

PRICES: Unless otherwise specified, prices are F.O.B. in the place shown on the face of the PO and are exclusive of state sales and use taxes. No charge will be allowed for packing, crating, drayage, or storage. The seller warrants those prices charged for the goods and/or services are not higher than those charged to any other customer for goods and/or services of like grade and quality in similar or lesser quantities.

PAYMENT: Seller shall be paid upon submission of properly prepared invoices in accordance with Buyer's invoicing instructions for materials and supplies delivered to and accepted by Buyer. Any adjustments in Seller's invoice due to shortages, rejection, or other failure to comply with the provisions of this Contract, or under any other order or contract between Buyer and Seller, may be made by Buyer before payment. Discount periods shall commence ten (10) days after the latest of scheduled delivery, actual delivery, or receipt of invoice. No charges will be honored unless specified on the face of the PO. Invoices must be accompanied by transportation receipt if transportation is payable as a separate item.

WARRANTY: Seller warrants those goods ordered to specifications will conform thereto and to any drawings, samples, or other description furnished or adopted by Buyer, and will be fit and sufficient for the purpose intended; and that all goods are merchantable, of good material and workmanship, and free from defects. Regarding any services provided under this Contract, Seller warrants: 1) that Seller is qualified to perform all services required of the Seller by this Contract; 2) that Seller possesses all licenses required of all public entities having jurisdiction over the Seller and the Buyer to perform such services; and 3) that Seller's workmanship will conform to all specifications and will perform as specified. Such warranties, together with Seller's other service warranties and guarantees, if any, shall survive inspection, test, acceptance of, and payment for the goods and/or services and shall run to Buyer, its successors, assigns, customers at any tier, and ultimate user and joint users. Notices of any defects or nonconformity shall be given by the Buyer to the Seller within fifteen (15) months after acceptance by ultimate user; provided however that in the event the goods are designed by Seller, notice must be given within three (3) years after acceptance by ultimate user. The rights and remedies of the Buyer concerning latent defects shall exist indefinitely and shall not be affected in anyway by any terms and conditions of this Contract, including this clause. Buyer may, at its option, and in addition to other remedies available at law, either (i) return for credit, (ii) require prompt correction or replacement of the defective or nonconforming goods and/or services, or (iii) have the defective items corrected or replaced at Seller's expense and deduct the cost thereof from any monies due Seller. The return to Seller of any defective or nonconforming goods and delivery to Buyer of any corrected or replaced goods and/or services shall be at Seller's expense. Goods and/or

services required to be corrected or replaced shall be subject to the provision of this paragraph and the paragraph of this Contract Document entitled "inspection" in the same manner and to the same extent as goods and/or services originally delivered under this Contract. In addition to correcting or replacing any defective or nonconforming goods and/or services, Seller shall also reimburse Buyer for all costs and expenses incurred by Buyer in connection with inspection and discovery of the defects, identifying and correcting the cause of such defects and all other activities reasonably undertaken by Buyer to obtain conforming goods and/or services or attempting to obtain from the ultimate user a waiver to permit the defective goods and/or services to be used with all or part of the defective conditions.

BUYER'S ASSISTANCE AND COOPERATION: During Seller's performance of this contract, the Buyer may, but has no obligation to, provide assistance to, or cooperate with, Seller in activities that facilitate the proper performance and completion of this Contract by Seller. Such assistance and cooperation may include without limitation: (i) providing engineering or other analysis or advice on correcting manufacturing deficiencies or other problems; (ii) acquiescing in a change of manufacturing facilities or location; (iii) refraining from strict enforcement of time schedule requirements under the Contract; (iv) permitting use of test materials or documentation not performed or produced under this Contract. Such assistance or cooperation by Buyer shall not be construed, and Seller agrees that it will not claim that any such assistance or cooperation operates, to relieve Seller from complete, proper, and punctual performance of all of Seller's obligations under this Contract.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS: Seller warrants that in the performance of this order Seller will comply with all applicable statutes, rules, regulations, and orders of the United States, and of any State or political subdivision thereof, and agrees to indemnify Buyer against any loss, cost, damage or liability, by reason of Seller's violation of this warranty.

CHANGES: Buyer may at any time, by a written notice, and without notice to sureties or assignees, make changes within the general scope of this Contract. If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for, the performance of any part of the work under this Contract, whether changed or not changed by any such order, or affects any such order, or affects any other provisions of this Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the price or delivery schedule, or both, and in such other provisions of this Contract as may be affected, and this Contract shall be modified in writing accordingly. Any claim by Seller for adjustment under this paragraph shall be asserted in writing within twenty (20) days from the date of receipt of the written notice directing the change. Where the cost of property made obsolete or excess because of a change is included in the equitable adjustment, Buyer shall have the right to prescribe the manner of disposition of such property. The amount of any price increase from a change shall be based on the actual reasonable cost to perform the change. The amount of any price decrease from a change shall be based on the reduction in the Seller's cost that reasonably should have occurred because of the change. Seller shall maintain complete and accurate accounting records properly documenting the foregoing cost, and such records shall be produced for examination and copying by Buyer within ten (10) days of a request by Buyer. Failure to agree to any adjustment shall be a dispute within the meaning of the "Disputes" paragraph of this Contract Document. However, nothing in this paragraph shall excuse the Seller from proceeding with the Contract as changed. Any action taken by Seller which affects any provision of this Contract, including delivery and price, whether or not accomplished with the concurrence of Buyer's employees, shall not entitle Seller to an equitable adjustment in accordance with this paragraph, unless such action has been specifically directed by written notice issued by Buyer.

STOP WORK ORDER: Buyer may at any time, by written notice to Seller, require Seller to stop all or any part of the work called for by this Contract for a period of up to ninety (90) days after the notice is delivered to Seller ("Stop Work Order"). Upon receipt of the Stop Work Order, Seller shall forthwith comply with its terms and take all reasonable steps to minimize the incurrence of costs allocable to the work covered by the order during the period of work stoppage. Within a period of ninety (90) days after a Stop Work Order is delivered to Seller, or within any extension of that period to which the parties shall have agreed, Buyer shall either cancel the Stop Work Order, or terminate the work covered by this Contract as provided in the "Termination for Default" or the "Termination for Convenience" paragraphs of this Contract Document, whichever may be appropriate. The seller shall resume work upon cancellation or expiration of any Stop Work Order. An equitable adjustment shall be

made in the delivery schedule or price hereunder, or both, and this Contract shall be modified in writing accordingly, if the Stop Work Order results in an increase in the time required for the performance of this order or in Seller's costs properly allocable thereto. The amount of any adjustment in the Contract price shall be determined as provided in the "Changes" paragraph of this Contract Document.

TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT:

(a) Buyer may, subject to the provisions of subparagraph (c) below, by written notice of default to Seller, terminate the whole or any part of this Contract in any one of the following circumstances: (i) if Seller fails to make delivery of the goods and/or services or to perform this Contract within the time specified herein or any extension thereof; or (ii) if Seller fails to perform any of the other provisions of this Contract, or so fails to make progress as to endanger performance of this Contract in accordance with its terms, and does not cure such failure within a period of ten (10) days or longer period (as Buyer may authorize in writing) after receipt of notice from Buyer specifying such failure.

(b) In the event Buyer terminates this Contract in whole or in part as provided in subparagraph (a) above, Buyer may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as Buyer may deem appropriate, supplies or services similar to those so terminated, and Seller shall be liable to Buyer for any excess costs for the same, including without limitation all costs and expenses of the type specified in the "WARRANTY" paragraph of this Contract Document; provided, that Seller shall continue the performance of this Contract to the extent not terminated hereunder.

(c) Except with respect to defaults of subcontractors, Seller shall not be liable for any excess costs if the failure to fulfil this Contract arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of Seller. Such causes may include, but are not limited to, acts of God, or of the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, flood, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and unusually severe weather, but in every case the failure to perform must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of Seller.

If the failure to perform is caused by the default of a subcontractor, and if such default arises out of causes beyond the control of both Seller and the subcontractor, and without the fault or negligence of either of them, Seller shall not be liable for any excess costs for failure to perform, unless the supplies or services to be furnished by the subcontractor were obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit Seller to meet the required delivery schedule. The term(s) "subcontractor(s)" shall mean subcontractor(s) at any tier.

(d) If this Contract is terminated as provided in subparagraph (a) above, Buyer, in addition to any other rights provided in this Contract, may require Seller to transfer title and deliver to Buyer in the manner and to the extent directed by Buyer, (i) any completed goods, and (ii) such partially completed goods and materials, parts, tools, dies, jigs, fixtures, plans, drawings, information, and contract rights (hereinafter called "manufacturing materials") as Seller has specifically produced or specifically acquired for the performance of such part of this Contract as has been terminated; and Seller shall, upon direction of Buyer, protect and preserve property in the possession of Seller in which Buyer has an interest. Payment for completed goods and/or services delivered to and accepted by the Buyer shall be at the Contract price. Payment for manufacturing materials delivered to and accepted by Buyer and for the protection and preservation of property shall be in an amount agreed upon by Buyer and Seller; failure to agree to such amount shall be a dispute concerning a question of fact within the meaning of the paragraph of this order entitled "Disputes." Buyer may withhold from amounts otherwise due Seller for such completed supplies or manufacturing materials such sum as Buyer determines to be necessary to protect Buyer or the Government against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders or for damages otherwise caused by Seller's failure to perform its obligations under the Contract.

(e) If, after notice of termination of this Contract under the provisions of this paragraph, it is determined for any reason that Seller was not in default under the provisions above, or that the default was excusable under the provisions of this paragraph, the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the notice of

termination had been issued pursuant to the "Termination for Convenience" paragraph of this Contract Document.

(f) The rights and remedies of Buyer provided in this paragraph shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Contract.

TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE: Buyer may at any time by written notice terminate all or any part of this Contract for Buyer's convenience. If this Contract is terminated, in whole or in part, for Buyer's convenience, Seller shall be paid an amount, to be mutually agreed upon, which shall be adequate to cover the actual reasonable cost paid by Seller for the actual labor and material reasonably used by Seller to perform the work under this Contract to the effective date of termination, plus a reasonable profit thereon; provided that no amount shall be paid to Seller for (i) any anticipatory profits related to work under this Contract not yet performed, or (ii) costs incurred due to Seller's failure to terminate work as ordered on the effective date of termination. In no event shall the total amount paid under the provisions of this paragraph exceed the prices set forth in this Contract for the work terminated. If a Government contract number is cited on the face of the PO, a termination for Buyer's convenience shall be accomplished in accordance with FAR 52.249, as in effect on the date of this Contract, which shall be controlling over any conflicting provisions hereof.

INDEMNIFICATION: If this Contract is issued under a Government prime contract or subcontract, Seller shall indemnify Buyer against and hold Buyer harmless from all claims, expenses, and losses, arising out of performance of this Contract by Seller (i) when such claims, expenses, and losses result from the failure of Seller to furnish to Buyer, in accordance with the provisions of the relevant regulations, cost or pricing data, which is accurate, complete and current at the time of Seller's and Buyer's agreement to the negotiated price or at the time when Buyer requests a reaffirmation of the same, and (ii) when such claims, expenses and losses result from Seller's failure to comply with the rules and regulations, connection with covered contracts.

DATA: All drawings and specifications, furnished or paid for by Buyer shall be the property of Buyer, shall be subject to removal at any time without additional cost upon demand by Buyer, shall be used only in filling orders from Buyer, and shall be kept separate from other drawings and specifications, and identified as the property of Buyer. The information contained in reports, drawings, documents, or other records which are furnished to Seller by Buyer relative to this Contract, to the extent that such information is not in the public domain, shall not be disclosed to others, except to subcontractors as necessary for completion of this Contract, in which event the subcontractor shall have the same obligation of nondisclosure. Upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this Contract, Seller shall return all drawings and specifications to Buyer, in the event Buyer requests return of any such items, within thirty (30) days after the effective date of completion, termination, or cancellation. Any such data of Buyer retained by the Seller shall remain subject to the foregoing restrictions on use, reproduction, and disclosure. Upon termination of this Contract, either for default or convenience, Buyer may, at Buyer's option, use, on a non-exclusive basis, all drawings, documents, or other records related to this Contract whether created by Buyer or Seller without further compensation to Seller. Seller may not disclose the existence of this Contract or the items to be supplied hereunder without Buyer's written consent, except to subcontractors who shall have the same responsibility.

WORK ON BUYER'S DESIGNATED PREMISES: If Seller, Seller's employees or agents or Seller's subcontractors enter Buyer's designated premises for any reason in connection with this Contract, Seller and such other parties shall observe all security requirements and all plant safety, plant protection, and traffic regulations. Seller shall defend, indemnify, and hold Buyer harmless from all claims, actions, demands, loss, and causes of action, arising from injury, including death, to any person, or damage to any property, when such injury or damage results in whole or in part from the acts or omissions of Seller, Seller's employees or agents, save and except damage caused by the sole negligence of Buyer. Seller, and any subcontractor used by Seller in connection with this Contract, shall carry Workmen's Compensation and Employees' Liability Insurance to cover Seller's and subcontractor's legal liability on account of accidents to their employees. The seller and the subcontractor shall carry adequate Comprehensive General Liability and adequate Comprehensive Automobile Liability

Insurance covering accidents to their employees. Seller and the subcontractor shall carry adequate Comprehensive General Liability and adequate Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance covering legal liability of Seller and the subcontractor on account of accidents arising out of the operations of Seller or the subcontractor and resulting in bodily injury, including death, being sustained by any person or persons, or in any damage to property. At Buyer's request, Seller shall furnish to Buyer certificates from Seller's insurers showing such coverage in effect and agreeing to give Buyer ten (10) days' prior written notice of cancellation of the coverage.

ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTING: Seller shall not assign this Contract or any portion of this Contract, nor shall Seller subcontract for completed or substantially completed goods or services purchased hereunder without the prior express written consent of Buyer. No assignment or subcontract by Seller, including any assignment or subcontract to which Buyer consent, shall in any way relieve Seller from complete and punctual performance of this Contract, including without limitation all of Seller's obligations under the WARRANTY provisions of this Contract.

NOTICES: All notices required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given if delivered in writing personally or sent by United States certified or registered mail addressed to Seller or Buyer at the addresses set forth on the face of the PO, with postage thereon fully prepaid. The effective time of notice shall be the time of mailing.

WAIVER: No waiver by Buyer of any breach of this Contract or the granting of an extension for performance hereunder shall be deemed to be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach. Seller agrees that it will not claim that Buyer has waived any of Seller's performance requirements under this Contract, and no such waiver shall be effective to relieve Seller from complete and punctual performance of such requirements, unless such waiver is expressly stated in writing and signed by Buyer's representative (or his/her successor) who signed the PO.

DISPUTES: Pending resolution of any dispute hereunder, Seller shall proceed diligently with the performance of work, including the delivery of goods and/or services in accordance with Buyer's direction.

ORDER OF PRECEDENCE: This Contract constitutes the entire, fully integrated agreement of the parties as to the subject matter hereof. In the event of any inconsistency among the foregoing, the inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order: (i) the purchase order to which these terms and conditions are attached; (ii) these terms and conditions; (iii) the drawings; (iv) the specifications; and (v) the other documents incorporated by reference.

APPLICABLE LAW: The validity, performance and construction of this Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Georgia, excluding its choice of law rules. Jurisdiction and venue for any suit between the parties hereto arising out of or connected with this Contract, or the goods furnished hereunder shall lie only in the City of Clarkston (DeKalb County, Georgia).

CONFIGURATION CONTROL: Seller shall make no change in design, manufacturing, or assembly processes or source of supply, after approval of the first production test item or after acceptance of the first completed end item, without the written approval of the Buyer. The Seller agrees that any approval by Buyer of the first production test item or any acceptance by Buyer of the first completed end item shall not in any way relieve Seller from performing all requirements of this Contract, including Seller's obligations under the provisions of the "WARRANTY" paragraph of this Contract Document.



Insurance Requirements

Within ten (10) days of Notice of Award, and at all times that this contract is in force, the contractor shall obtain, maintain and furnish the City of Clarkston, Certificates of Insurance from licensed companies doing business in the State of Georgia and acceptable to the City of Clarkston covering:

Copies of these Certificates of Insurance shall be furnished to the City of Clarkston prior to execution of the contract. Such policies shall be non-cancellable except on thirty-day (30) written notice to the City of Clarkston.

Local Preference Policy

Local preference may be given to businesses that have a physical place of business located within city limits of City of Clarkston (DeKalb County, GA) as long as all requirements of the bid solicitation have been met. Should a local vendor submit a bid solicitation proposal that is not more than three percent (3%) greater than the bid solicitation of the lowest non-local vendor for bid solicitation up to \$150,000 or not more than three percent (3%) greater than the bid of the lowest non-local vendor for bid solicitation in excess of \$150,000, then the local vendor's bid solicitation shall be recommended for approval provided all requirements of the bid solicitation process have been met.

This policy shall not apply to any purchases of materials, equipment, or services in excess of \$1,000,000. The term business location means that the business has a staffed, fixed, physical place of business located within city limits of City of Clarkston and has had the same for at least one (1) year prior to the date of the business' submission of its bid solicitation, as applicable and holds a current valid business license from the City of Clarkston, for at least one (1) year.

Permits

A permit is required for new construction, temporary buildings, and alterations to existing construction (interior and exterior). The prime contractor shall be responsible for all inspections and ensuring compliance with all federal, state, and county laws and codes. The contractor shall be solely responsible for obtaining all permits.

Basis of Award

A contractual service contract shall be awarded for one (1) year with an option to renew for four (4), one (1) year periods. The optional renewal is based on performance during the term of the contract.

A construction bid solicitation must contain a bid bond acceptable to the City in an amount of no less than 5% of the amount bid. The contract awardee, depending on the project cost, will be required to provide a 100% Performance & Payment Bond, within 10 days of the award, before the issuance of the Notice to Proceed (NTP). All other required documents must be completed and executed by the contractor and his/her Surety and submitted to the Owner.

The performance bond shall remain in effect for one (1) year after final acceptance of the work or the guaranty period under the agreement, whichever is the larger. The payment bond shall remain in effect for the period required under Georgia law for the payment bonds on public construction agreements. Termination of Negotiations

The City at its sole discretion may, at any time, to the extent permitted by Applicable Law, exclude an Offeror from further participation in any negotiation process if the City determines that such Offeror is failing to progress in the negotiations or if the terms of its bid solicitation are less advantageous than those of other Offeror is deemed to be no longer susceptible of selection. The City will give written notice of its decision to the Offeror, which shall be sent in writing, signed by the City.

Additional or Supplemental Information

After receiving the bid solicitations, the City will evaluate the responses. To include contacting one or all references, reviewing financial statements, reviewing experience, and reviewing other data relating to the Offeror's qualifications.

If requested by the City of Clarkston Purchasing Division, the Offeror's might be required to submit additional or supplemental information to determine whether the Offeror meets all the qualification requirements. If not with its response, such evidence must be submitted to the City no later than five (5) business days at the request of the Purchasing Division representative.

Blackout Period/Restrictions on Communications

From the issue date of the solicitation and until a supplier is selected for contract award and the selection is made public, suppliers are not allowed to communicate for any reason with any City employee, elected official or Contractor regarding the solicitation except through the issuing officer (or his/her designee) named in the solicitation.

Prohibited communication includes all contact or interaction, including but not limited to telephonic communications, emails, faxes, letters, or personal meetings, such as lunch, entertainment, or otherwise.

Conflict of Interest

Every person, business or entity involved in the procurement process must adhere to a high standard of ethics. Each will be bound by the City Code of Ethics and this section.

Whenever this section conflicts with the City Code of Ethics, the City Code of Ethics should be controlled. For the purposes of this section, the term "City Employee" means any person employed by the City of Clarkston, and the term "City Official" means any elected or appointed official of the City or of an agency, authority, or instrumentality of the City.

Default and Termination

Termination by Consultant

The agreement resulting from this proposal shall be subject to Termination by Consultant in the event of any one or more of the following events: The default by City in the performance of any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement, and the failure of City to remedy, or undertake to remedy such default, for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of notice from Contractor to remedy the same.

Termination by City

The agreement resulting from this proposal shall be subject to termination by the City at any time in the opinion of the City; the Contractor fails to carry out the contract provisions of any one or more of the following events:

1. The default by consultant in the performance of any of the terms, covenants or conditions of the agreement, and the failure of Contractor to remedy, or undertake to remedy with sufficient forces and to the City's reasonable satisfaction, the City shall provide the vendor

with notice of any conditions which violate or endanger the performance of the Agreement. If after such notice the Contractor fails to remedy such conditions within thirty (30) days to the satisfaction of the City, the City may exercise their option in writing to terminate the Agreement without further notice to the Contractor and order the Contractor to stop work immediately and vacate the premises, to cancel ordered products and/or services with no expense to the City.

2. The Contractor's failure to conduct services according to the approved proposal specifications.
3. The Contractor's failure to keep, perform, or observe any other term or condition of this agreement.
4. The Contractor's performance of the contract is unmeasurably delayed.
5. Should the successful Contractor fail to provide the commodities or services when ordered, and in accordance with the General Terms and Conditions, specifications and any other requirements contained herein are not met, the City reserves the right to purchase commodities or services covered by this contract elsewhere if available from an alternate source.
6. The Contractor agrees in its proposal submission that the City's decision is final and valid.

Force Majeure

Neither party shall be held to be in breach of the Agreement resulting from this proposal, because of any failure to perform any of its obligations hereunder if said failure is due to any act of God, fire, flood, accident, strike, riot, insurrection, war, or any other cause over which that party has no control. Such party shall give notice and full particulars of such Force Majeure in writing to the other party within a reasonable time after the occurrence of the event and the obligation of the party giving such notice shall endeavor to remove or overcome such ability with all reasonable dispatch.

Waiver

The waiver of any breach, violation, or default in or with respect to the performance or observance of the covenants and conditions contained herein shall not be taken to constitute a waiver any subsequent breach, violation or default in or with respect to the same or any other covenant or condition hereof.

Sealed Bid Delivery Service(s)

SCOPE OF WORK

PURPOSE

The City of Clarkston (“City”) is requesting proposals from qualified professional consultants who seek to assist in developing a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for Greater Clarkston. The Plan will identify existing conditions and historical trends to provide a baseline level of crashes involving fatalities and serious injuries including an analysis of locations where there are crashes and the severity of the crashes, as well as contributing factors and crash types by relevant road users (motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists, transit users, etc.). The Vision Zero safety Action Plan will also recommend a comprehensive set of projects and strategies, create a prioritization framework for future project implementation countermeasures, including new policies, guidelines, and/or standards, that are shaped by data, the best available evidence, and noteworthy practices, as well as extensive stakeholder input that considers non-traditional approaches to solicit engagement and outreach that addresses the identified safety problems.

The Consultant(s) awarded this contract will have the primary responsibility of developing the Comprehensive Safety Action Plan document and will work in coordination with the City staff and various steering committees, non-profit and related agencies, Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT), Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) and DeKalb County.

Given the significant funding for this Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, the City will expect the selected Consultant(s) to provide robust data collection, analysis, metrics and public involvement that will lead to an implementable Action Plan that will be adopted by the Mayor and City Council then put into motion ultimately leading to significant reduction in vehicular and pedestrian accidents with a goal of no deaths for a period of time. The City encourages non-traditional strategies, technology and other methods to provide an end-product that will achieve the Cities SS4A goals identified in this Request for Proposal (RFP).

It is the goal of the City to promote local and minority business participation. The Consultant(s) shall make a good faith effort to identify and hire minority prime and/or subcontractors for this project.

PROJECT GOALS

The goal of this project is to provide city-wide planning documents, through a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, that leads to the elimination or substantial reduction of fatalities and serious injuries on the street network for the entirety of the 1.8 square mile Greater Clarkston planning area, including interaction and coordination with DeKalb County on their SS4A Safety Action Plan that was awarded in 2024. Specific corridor of interest to the City is the North Indian Creek Drive - Montreal Road Corridor which is located within the City and DeKalb County jurisdictions. This corridor experiences the greatest pedestrian activity within the Greater Clarkston area.

This Comprehensive Safety Action Plan will provide a framework for the City to address and mitigate safety issues across area including the cross-jurisdictional corridor of North Indian Creek Drive-Montreal Road.

The Comprehensive Safety Action Plan must also meet the goals of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Office of Safety's Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program. FHWA's goal is to reduce transportation related fatalities and serious injuries across the transportation system, and for this reason it fully supports the vision of zero deaths and serious injuries on the Nation's roads. To support this vision, FHWA continues to collaborate with other US DOT agencies to implement the National Roadway Safety Strategy (NRSS), which outlines the Department's comprehensive approach to significantly reduce deaths and serious injuries to zero on our Nation's roadways. The NRSS adopted the Safe System approach, which was founded on the principles that humans make mistakes and that human bodies have limited ability to tolerate crash impacts. Consultant(s) should refer to the USDOT guidance for developing Safety Action Plan provided via the USDOT website at www.transportation.gov/grants/SS4A/resources

INTRODUCTION

The Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary grant program funds are awarded on a competitive basis to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users, including pedestrians; bicyclists; public transportation, personal conveyance, and micro-mobility users; motorists; and commercial vehicle operators.

The City's SS4A program provides full funding for the completion of a Safety Action Plan as described in the following and as defined in the executed contract with the FHWA on December 20, 2023. Proposers to note that modifications exist to the executed SS4A Agreement. The modifications are identified in Article 6 – Special Grant Terms. They are as follows:

SCOPE of WORK

The Safety Action Plan document will include assembling and analyzing data regarding existing conditions within the established planning area and utilizing that data to develop recommended policies, actions, and an implementation plan to guide future development and decision making. Proposers shall understand that although the following guidance is from USDOT for SS4A, this guidance from a policy standpoint has been modified to reflect the requirements of the Executive

Branch of the federal government. The executed Safety Action Plan is essentially intact with a small number of modifications described in this RFP.

The goal of this Vision Zero Safety Action Plan is the elimination of pedestrian and traffic related deaths including the reduction in the number of significant injuries with stakeholder and community outreach and input critical to achieving this goal.

Proposers should also be aware that the narratives and project requirements in the executed agreement with the FHWA supplements the following Scope of Work.

The Consultant(s) will create and deliver a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan in compliance with SS4A standards. The Consultant(s) must adhere to the guidelines for Action Plans outlined in Safe Streets and Roads for All Action Plan Components. The Consultant(s) will ensure that each of the following requirements are met, and components are included in the Action Plan:

Leadership Commitment and Goal Setting

Include an official public commitment (e.g., resolution, policy, and ordinance) by the Mayor and City Council to an eventual goal of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries. The commitment must include a goal and timeline for eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries achieved through one, or both, of the following:

- A. The target date for achieving zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries, or
- B. An ambitious percentage reduction of roadway fatalities and serious injuries by a specific date with an eventual goal of eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries.
- C. Provide a draft and final Resolution at the outset of the project.

Planning Structure

Describe and report on the past and planned activities of the committee, task force, or similar body that is tasked with overseeing Action Plan development, implementation, and monitoring.

Safety Analysis

- A. The Consultant(s) will produce an analysis of existing conditions and historical trends that provides a baseline level of crashes involving fatalities and serious injuries within and adjacent to the boundaries of the City. In addition, data pertaining to property-damage-only crashes, near-misses, and other relevant data collected from community input should also be included in the analysis. The plan will include an analysis of locations where there are crashes and the severity of the crashes, as well as contributing factors and crash types by relevant road users including the following:
 - 1. *Vehicle Crashes*: Contributing factors for the 15 highest vehicular crash locations
 - 2. *Bicycle Crashes*: Contributing factors for the 10 highest crash locations which involve cyclists
 - 3. *Pedestrian Crashes*: Contributing factors for the 10 highest crash locations involving pedestrians
 - 4. *Other Crashes*: Contributing factors for the 5 highest crash locations involving

alternate travel modes not included above, such as micro-mobility, public transportation, and commercial operators

- B. Systemic and specific safety needs are to be analyzed (e.g., high-risk road features, specific safety needs of relevant road users, public health approaches, analysis of the built environment, demographic and structural issues, etc.). To the extent practical, the analysis should include all roadways within the jurisdiction without regard for ownership. Based on the analysis performed, geospatial identification of higher-risk locations is to be developed (a High-Injury Network or equivalent).
- C. The Consultant(s) should describe their approach to data collection and analysis of existing conditions in the study area. Provide the benefits/disadvantages of future data collection with respect to the City police department or the City Engineer staff for the purpose of reporting over a period of five (5) years.
- D. Research existing conditions and historical trends and provide a baseline level of crashes involving fatalities and serious injuries across Greater Clarkston and adjoining jurisdiction DeKalb County on the North Indian Creek Drive-Montreal Road Corridor
- E. Develop metrics to allow the city to track the progress of the SS4A Vision Zero Safety Action Plan over a period of five (5) years.
- F. Discuss accident data sources and opportunities to obtain from non-traditional sources such as the GM Vehicle Data Software, vendor software, etc.

Engagement and Collaboration

- A. The development of the Comprehensive Action Plan requires robust engagement with the public and relevant stakeholders, including the private sector and community groups, that allows for both community representation and feedback. Information received from engagement and collaboration is to be analyzed and incorporated into the Action Plan. Plans and processes are coordinated and aligned with other governmental plans and planning processes to the extent practical.
The engagement and coordination shall also occur with DeKalb County and their awarded SS4A grant on all cross jurisdictional roadway/street networks within the Study Area.
- B. The Consultant(s) will create an engagement strategy for both public and key stakeholder outreach. The engagement strategy should include the overall outreach and engagement framework, approach, process and schedule, strategies, and format. It should also include a list of materials and/or media to be developed to implement that framework, including notices and announcements, public meeting agendas, publicity materials, presentations, display boards, project website, etc.
Various engagement strategies should be considered to gather the information necessary to prepare the final deliverable that responds to stakeholder interests and concerns
- C. Seek other inter-governmental and intra-governmental collaborations such as the City of Tucker, ARC, GDOT, etc.

Outreach and Stakeholder Considerations

- A. Develop the Action Plan using a representative process.
- B. Collaborate with translation/interpretation partners where language barriers may exist.
- C. Consider the impact of proposed projects and strategies as it relates to the significant non-English speaking immigrant population and their understanding of the proposed

improvements.

- D. Interact and receive feedback with the non-English speaking population and offer recommendations for improvements that are understandable to this sector of the population

Policy and Process Changes

- A. Analyze existing policies, standards, manuals, plans, and guidelines.
- B. Identify opportunities to improve how processes prioritize transportation safety within the existing ordinances and standards and recommendations for replacement.
- C. Incorporate the implementation of revised or new policies into the Action Plan.

Strategy and Project Selections for Safety Action Plan

- A. Address safety problems identified using proven countermeasures focused on a Safe System Approach.
 - 1. Prioritize deployment of mitigation strategies and countermeasures.
 - 2. List specific projects or strategies with timeframes.
- B. Explain criteria used for prioritization
- C. Research case studies and Best Practices throughout the US and provide a list of potential countermeasures. The FHWA “Proven Safety Countermeasure” web site lists various countermeasures. The Consultant(s) shall also consider non-traditional systems such as Automated Reckless Speed Warning devices, and other approaches that are not currently utilized and approved by the FHWA.
- D. Projects and strategies should focus on infrastructure, behavioral and/or operational safety and be shaped by data, the best available evidence and noteworthy practices, and stakeholder input considerations that will address the safety problems described in the Action Plan.
- E. The Consultant(s) should describe their experience with the Safe Systems approach, Vision Zero, Complete Streets, Public Rights-of-Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG), and other road safety practices. Strategies and projects will cover physical improvements and implementation recommendations for at least forty (40) of the highest crash prone locations and will include a combination of low cost, low-tech designs with more complex interventions which are data-driven and innovative.
- F. Short-term goals of 1-2 years, mid-term of 3-5 years and long-term goals of 6-9 years to be provided.
- G. “Line Drawing” conceptual plans, utilizing the most accurate and latest aerial imagery, shall be developed for the North Indian Creek Drive - Montreal Road Corridor; from Memorial Drive in DeKalb County to the US Highway 78 overpass at the City of Tucker City Limits for purposes of identifying safety counter measures and other recommendations to transform this corridor into a safe environment for pedestrian and vehicular mobility in the future. Surveying is not permitted but field reconnaissance and measurements, data collection and other relevant information is to be applied for the purposes of developing a Vision Zero Safety Action Plan that will lead to a future implementable project (s).
- H. Identification of American Disabilities Act (ADA) deficiencies and a plan for correction, including costs, city-wide shall be developed.

Progress and Transparency

- A. The Consultant(s) will develop the method for measuring to include advertising progress

with guidance from the City's Public Relations staff, City Administration and Point of Contact or designee.

- B. The Consultant(s) will be responsible for data reporting during the performance period.
- C. Establish a means to ensure ongoing transparency with residents and other relevant stakeholders.
- D. Include, at a minimum, annual public and accessible reporting on progress toward reducing roadway fatalities and serious injuries and public posting of the Action Plan online.

CONTRACTOR EXPECTATION

The Contractor(s) will be expected to conduct the following tasks, and the City strongly encourages proposers to expand on these tasks, emphasize tasks and to suggest additional tasks not identified in this RFP that may be necessary or beneficial. Sub-Consultant(s) are permitted under this contract.

Project coordination meetings, weekly updates, and City review of materials

The Contractor(s) is expected to meet regularly with the City for project coordination that includes, but is not limited to, discussion of ongoing tasks; presenting or discussion on draft project deliverables; and addressing unforeseen development challenges and/or adjusting development process. When appropriate, these meetings may be via in-person or video conference. Other additional project coordination expectations include:

- A. The City's POC will be the City's contracted engineering firm or designee.
- B. Upon contract executive, hold a kickoff meeting with City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee to review a project timeline, schedule meetings and begin the process of data acquisition.
- C. Upon contract execution, a Kickoff meeting with a full presentation shall be presented to the Mayor and City Council identifying the scope of work for the SS4A.
- D. Draft materials for review and comment by the City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee in accordance with a schedule developed at the beginning of the planning process.
- E. Provide, at a minimum, weekly updates, via e-mail, outlining work completed by the Consultant(s) and/or sub-Consultant(s). Provide written status reports bi-weekly and status update presentations monthly to the City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee.
- F. Preparation of written quarterly progress and performance reports, draft final report and final report addressing SS4A post award reporting requirements and performance measures; including metrics developed in the initial planning meetings.
- G. Quarterly reporting is to be prepared by the Consultant(s) and reviewed and submitted to FHWA by the City POC.

Meetings with the Safety Action Plan Steering Committee, Stakeholder Groups, Staff, Mayor and City Council

A Safety Action Plan steering committee will be charged with oversight of the Action Plan development, implementation, and monitoring. The City will develop the steering committee members. The Consultant(s), in association with the City's City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee, will meet with the Steering Committee to collect input and provide updates.

In addition, the Consultant(s) will solicit input and feedback from the Steering Committee and City's City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee and provide interim reports, presentations, and updates at each monthly meeting and attend the Plan's draft plan to Mayor and City Council and the formal adoption of the plan by the City. The Consultant(s) shall also provide in-person quarterly reports to the Mayor and City Council, and in-person presentation to the Atlanta Regional Commission Transportation Coordination Committee (TCC) prior to completion of the draft report.

Public Engagement and Communications

Public participation is essential to this planning effort, and we expect robust engagement with the public and relevant stakeholders, including the private sector and community groups and non-profits, that allows for both community representation and feedback.

Information received from the engagements and collaborations should be analyzed and incorporated into the Action Plan. Plans and processes should be coordinated and aligned with other governmental plans and planning processes to the extent practical. Other expectations include:

- A. Meetings to be held with the City remove city twice Administration and the Point of Contact or designee, citizen groups, applicable advisory committees, public and private schools on North Indian Creek Drive, churches and other relevant group as outlined below
- B. Plan and implement a stakeholder and public outreach process using a range of methods to inform and involve stakeholders, citizen organizations and the public.
- C. There will be a total of six (6) In-Person Public Information Meetings (PIOH) over the duration of the planning process.
- D. Conduct in-person interview meetings with the Mayor and all six (6) Council Members, twenty (20) private sector businesses, ten (10) community leaders and all steering committee members. The Consultant(s) will lead stakeholder outreach and participation efforts with the City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee helping where needed.
- E. Given the significant number of languages spoken in the City, the City will require that the draft and final reports be translated into six (6) languages. The City will provide these languages to the Consultant(s). All PIOH handouts and all correspondence announcing PIOH meetings shall be translated into these six (6) languages. There will be translators for these six (6) languages at each of the PIOH meetings. The Consultant(s) shall provide written responses, in the appropriate languages, to those that provide written comments at each PIOH.
- F. Non-Traditional outreach efforts shall be presented with the submitted proposal. Refer to the attached Federal Guidance document on the use of federal funds. This effort is critical to maximize the opportunity for as many residents as possible to understand their respective concerns with safe and efficient mobility throughout the City.
- G. Prepare a draft plan document for public review and comment. The plan should be prepared and presented in a format and in languages that is user-friendly and easily understood by the public.
- H. Respondents should explain their approach and public participation plan in detail in the submitted proposal.

Safety Action Plan Development

The Consultant(s) will serve as the primary drafter of the plan and shall conduct research and develop materials for the Plan, including but not limited to:

- A. Review all existing plans, maps, documents, data and other materials relevant to the project. The City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee will provide all existing available documentation to the Consultant(s). The Consultant(s) will study and consolidate applicable materials into the Safety Action Plan.
- B. Review crash history to include locations and severity of incidents as part of an analysis of systemic and specific safety needs and development of a High Injury Network.
- C. Develop Safety Action Plan vision, goals, and objectives.
- D. Develop policies and projects for the future implementation of recommended strategies based on technical data and public input. Each project shall be identified on a map identifying location, existing deficiencies, proposed improvements, conceptual cost estimates, and other related data
- E. Prepare a draft document and present at all associated meetings and public hearings for review and comment.
- F. Complete a final draft of the Safety Action Plan and present it to each stakeholder and the Steering Committee that is developed by the City.
- G. Provide digital, editable, working and printable copies of all final documents including reports, maps, and final plan.

PROJECT DELIVERABLES

Maps and associated digital data and shapefiles shall be in ArcGIS format and shall be provided to the City's City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee as work is being conducted. All such data, graphics, charts, images, etc. as contained in the final adopted version of the Safety Action Plan as adopted by the Mayor and City Council shall also be furnished and property of the City upon adoption. An editable version of the final document shall also be provided. The selected Consultant(s) shall:

- A. Act in the best interests of the Mayor and City and use their best efforts to deliver the Project in an expeditious and cost-effective manner consistent with the City's City Administration and the Point of Contact or designee project requirements, time constraints, and budget.
- B. Develop a contractually obligated overall project schedule and will be responsible for coordination of all work, in addition to miscellaneous contracts, if needed, for completion of the project within its predetermined budget limits and schedule. At each biweekly meeting the schedule shall be updated and disseminated to all attendees.
- C. Be responsible for project management to include coordinating regular project meetings with the City, including producing all meeting materials, notices, attendance lists, minutes/summaries, etc. A project timeline to be provided in the proposal and updated as needed during the life of the project.

Upon adoption, the Consultant(s) shall provide thirty (30) printed copies of the final document for distribution to the City Council, Mayor and each Steering Committee and Stakeholder Group. In addition, the Consultant(s) should also provide flash drives of all digital products in the following forms as appropriate:
